### Wednesday 10th August 2016

Bus to Robert Ross, Speddoch & Muil, 45 Belted Galloway cows at Speddoch and 20 cows at Muil, also a total of 1170 Blackface ewes grazing 2800 acres in total. Then on to Jim and Selina Ross, Romesbeoch, Shawhead, Dumfries 23 Black Galloway cows, 140 cross bred cows and 550 ewes. Lunch will be served at Drumlanrig Castle, home of the Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry. The Duke is President of the Galloway Cattle Society and member of the Belted Galloway Society. The Castle is steeped in History and you will be shown round the Castle and learn about its 600 year history, also to be seen is the Buccleuch Collection which is particularly renowned for its furniture and for its silver. Last farm of the day, John and Anne Finlay, Blackcraig, Corsock, Castle Douglas 120 Black Galloway cows and 720 Blackface Sheep

How to get here

#### By Road:

From the M74 or A75. Come off at the Gretna (Gretna Green) junction and follow the brown tourist signs. From M74 going North take Junction 45, going South take Junction 22.

#### By Rail:

Trains from Carlisle and Glasgow stop at the Gretna Green station. We are a 5 minute walk away.

#### By Air:

We are 90 miles from Glasgow Airport and Edinburgh Airport, 70 miles from Newcastle Airport and 150 miles from Manchester Airport.
